PET SAFETY

- Keep cats indoors, especially at night
- Keep dogs on leashes and supervise closely
- Never let dogs interact with coyotes
- Pick up small dogs if coyotes approach
- Consider a coyote repellent outfit for dogs

IF A COYOTE APPROACHS

- **Be Big, Brave and Loud**
- Don't run away, slowly back away maintaining eye contact
- Stand Tall with arms overhead
- Yell "Go away coyote" this is called hazing

NEVER FEED COYOTES

- Seal garbage and compost securely
- Remove ripe garden veggies and fruit, pick up fallen fruit
- Store pet food and feed pets inside

THINK YOU SAW A COYOTE?

Your reports will help us track coyote movements and behaviors. Report all coyote sightings to Security as soon as you can. Report aggressive coyotes or coyotes that directly approach people

REPORTING

Being aware of and being able to target problematic individual coyotes is our best line of defense. Total eradication is proven not to work, only pave the way for new potentially problematic coyotes



EDUCATION

HAZING

Hazing is a series of activities that attempts to re-instill fear of humans back into bold coyotes. It involves using deterrents and repellents to move a coyote out of an area and discourage an undesirable behavior
