During 2015 we had 78 Loggerhead turtle nests

To keep the turtles coming at night they need a clear dark path beyond the high tide line. So when leaving the beach at the end of the day, knock down the sand castles you built, fill in the hole you dug, take your trash off the beach and remove tents and chairs. When you go for your nightly beach walk please leave the flashlights off, and if you should happen upon a sea turtle do not approach as this will disrupt her egg laying process. Violations subject to \$100 fine and property confiscation



The wildlife is fabulous

Admire our wildlife, but keep your distance. Feeding the deer and gators does not help them. Deer need to be able to support themselves year round. A fed gator will need to be put down as it will become aggressive with humans. Remember gators are dangerous, keep your distance and never harass them. Fines for infractions of pet & wildlife rules are from \$25 to \$200

Getting around on Fripp



Golf carts, scooters, mopeds & bikes are great ways to get around. There are miles of bike/walking paths on Fripp Island. Please use them. High speed bike riding should be done on the roads. Drivers and passengers (under 21) of mopeds or scooters must wear helmets. Keep in mind only licensed drivers may operate golf carts. Drivers are subject to all State & Fripp motor vehicle regulations. Please observe all posted parking regulations. Do not block driveways, roadways or bicycle paths. Motor vehicles are not allowed on the beach or bike paths. ATVs & Segways cannot be driven on Fripp Island. Hoverboards may only be operated on private property. Recreational Vehicles are permitted to load and unload only. Golf carts and Low Speed Vehicles brought to Fripp by non property owners must pay a \$50.00 annual registration fee and show proof of insurance within 24 hours of arrival.

Fines for infractions of Traffic Rules - \$25 to \$300 with extra charges for impound when necessary.

General Rules & Regulations

Do not discharge firearms of any type on the island. Do not set off fireworks on the island. Blow/dart guns are not permitted on the Island. Keep pets on leash and please clean up after them. Excessive noise is prohibited 10:00 pm to 7:00 am. No minor, under 18, allowed on common property between 12:00 am and 5:00 am, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. Persons under 21 may not operate golf carts between 12:00 am and 5:00 am. All motorized watercraft shall be operated in a safe manner to protect wildlife and prevent damage to the marsh. Do not operate motorized watercraft within 50 feet of people in the water or faster than idle speed when within 100 yards of the beach. Citations of \$25 to \$200 may be issued. State citations may be issued where appropriate.
